



Lenten peace! Ashes and snow mark Lent this year here in New England - for the moment, spring is but a hope buried under two-plus feet of snow.

This latest edition of our occasional newsletter for the **Connections** community comes with prayers that this Lent will be a time of renewed hope and transforming joy for you and those you love and serve. Thanks for taking a moment during these busy forty days to join our conversation on the ministry of preaching and proclamation.

A Lenten road we didn't expect to take.

This is already an historic Lent for our Church. Just as you are receiving this, the cardinals are having their first meeting to prepare for the conclave to elect a successor to Pope Benedict XVI, who shocked the world by resigning the papacy two days before Ash Wednesday.

Much "pontificating" from all sides about the future of our Church has taken place these past few weeks.

This scribe offers this:
Regardless of one's perspective on the state of the
Church and one's assessment of Benedict's legacy, we all have to be moved by
Benedict's humility.
Benedict has been honest enough about his own health, including his intellectual and mental faculties, to accept the reality that he can no longer fulfill the office with the energy and strength he believes



the leadership of the Church requires. He has placed whatever will be in the hands of God and trusts the Spirit to animate and inspire the outcome. Benedict's act is one of humility that is centered in faith; of generosity of spirit that is nothing less than of God; of service that mirrors Christ in its selflessness. In his humble and graceful departure, Benedict has made Peter's office less mystical and removed and more human and approachable.

May Pope Benedict's humility and courage inspire all of us to greater compassion, selfless justice, and healing reconciliation during this especially compelling Lenten season.

O God, true shepherd of all the faithful, look with kindness on your servant Pope Benedict XVI, whom you set as head and shepherd of Your Church. ... We give you thanks for your grace at work in him as he had led us by word and example: in his teaching, in his prayer and in his great love. n advertisement on late night television recently offered a two CD set featuring the "Queens of Country Music." One of the tunes is *I Beg Your Pardon*. Remember it? But God has promised strength for the day,
Rest for the labor, light for the way,
Grace for the trials, help from above,
Unfailing sympathy, undying love.




