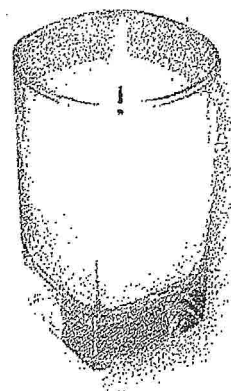



The parable of the prodigal son: "... we must celebrate and rejoice, because your brother was dead and has come to life again . . ." Luke 15: 1-3

In Jesus' parable, the prodigal son finally faces the reality of how badly he has messed up when he finds himself tending the pigs. We all have those "pig sty" epiphanies: when we finally face the mess our selfishness, our insensitivity, our dishonesty has made of our lives and the lives of those we love. Lent calls us to embrace God's grace - grace that enables us to lift ourselves out of the mud of our sins to reconnect again with family and friends, grace that empowers us to jettison our selfishness and deceptions and re-create our broken lives into new beginnings of reconciliation and restoration.

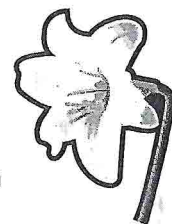

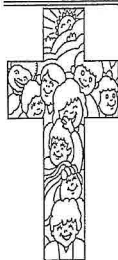

**A Lenten road we didn't expect to take.**

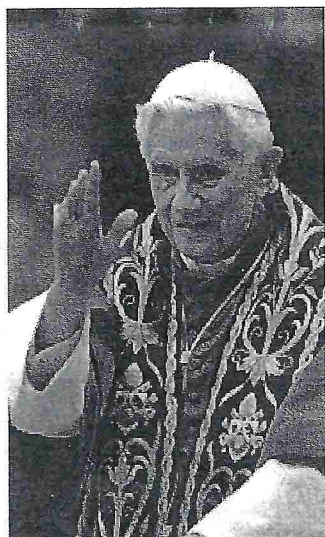
This is already an historic Lent for our Church. Just as you are receiving this, the cardinals are having their first meeting to prepare for the conclave to elect a successor to Pope Benedict XVI, who shocked the world by resigning the papacy two days before Ash Wednesday.

Much "pontificating" from all sides about the future of our Church has taken place these past few weeks.

This scribe offers this:

Regardless of one's perspective on the state of the Church and one's assessment of Benedict's legacy, we all have to be moved by Benedict's humility. Benedict has been honest enough about his own health, including his intellectual and mental faculties, to accept the reality that he can no longer fulfill the office with the energy and strength he believes the leadership of the Church requires. He has placed whatever will be in the hands of God and trusts the Spirit to animate and inspire the outcome. Benedict's act is one of humility that is centered in faith; of generosity of spirit that is nothing less than of God; of service that mirrors Christ in its selflessness. In his humble and graceful departure, Benedict has made Peter's office less mystical and removed and more human and approachable.

May Pope Benedict's humility and courage inspire all of us to greater compassion, selfless justice, and healing reconciliation during this especially compelling Lenten season.

## I Beg Your Pardon

An advertisement on late night television recently offered a two CD set featuring the “Queens of Country Music.” One of the tunes is *I Beg Your Pardon*. Remember it? In the song, the listener is reminded that the singer never promised a beautiful garden full of roses and comfort or ease and prosperity. Sometimes life and love can be tough, hard work.

Jesus said, “In this world you will have trouble,” and the Apostle James encouraged us to “count it all joy” when we meet various trials.

If troubles and trials are an inescapable part of life for Christian Stewards, we are wise to learn to deal with them. People have an amazing capacity to adjust to and overcome difficulties, as the Inuit of Arctic Circle lands suffer bone-chilling cold and the Pulaar and other people of the Saheel, just south of the Sahara desert endure skin-searing heat and aridity. They could move from their ancestral homelands but they don’t.

Most of us live in a more comfortable climate, but we still manage to find troubles and trials no matter how easy a life, by comparison, we have. It may help us in adjusting to this reality if we remember other promises God has made. Perhaps these lines of verse from an unknown poet will help.

Flower-strewn pathways all our lives through;  
God has not promised sun without rain,  
Joy without sorrow, peace without pain.  
But God has promised strength for the day,  
Rest for the labor, light for the way,  
Grace for the trials, help from above,  
Unfailing sympathy, undying love.*

## Have You Forgotten? *New Year Resolutions*

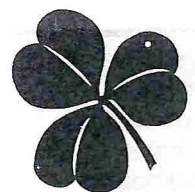

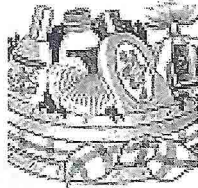

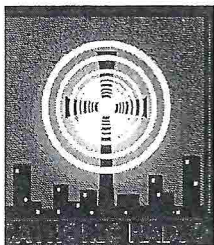
